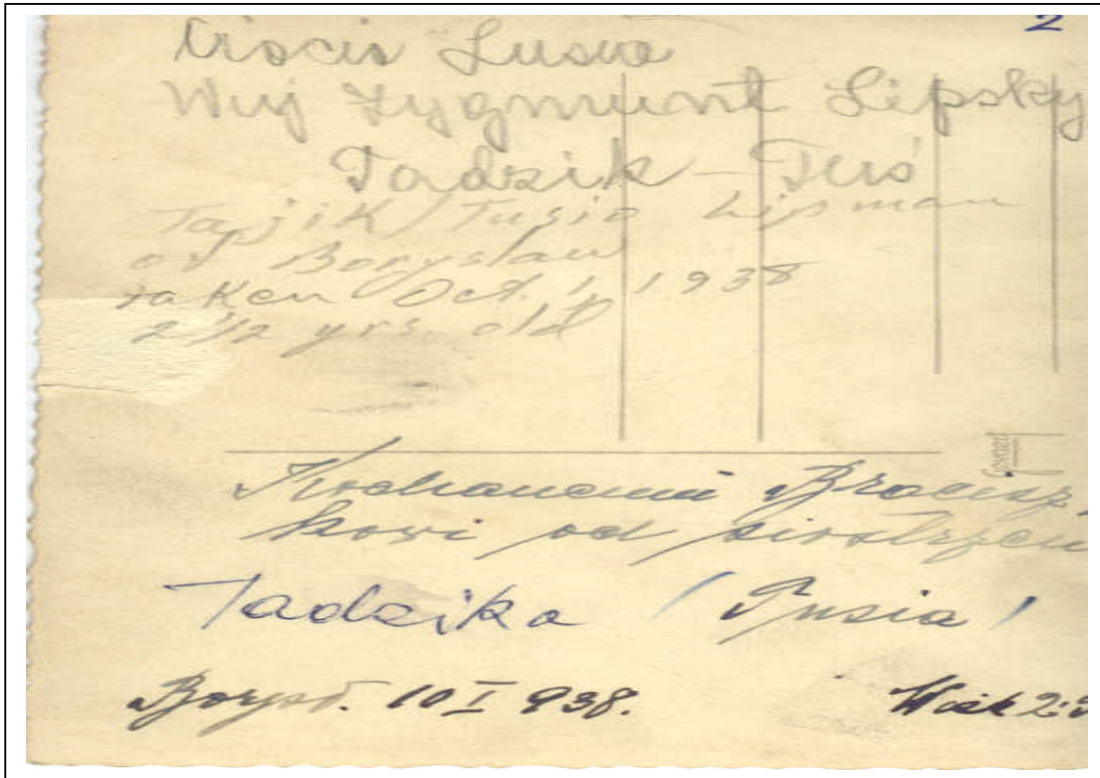
Tusio was named after his grandfather Naftali Fischman.

In 1941, Aunt Lora sent a letter (by smugglers) to come and take Tusio.

Boryslaw was already under German occupation (July 1, 1941) but there wasn't a ghetto yet (Aug, 1942). Tusio had blond hair and could be easily mistaken to be Christian. The little boy would often say "I am Tudek". The plan was to bring Tusio to a priest who would take care of him, in case anything happened to both parents.

Carola had returned to Krakow and made arrangements with a "False Deutsche" Pole, who was returning to Bielsko, to pay him for taking care of Tusio and smuggling him to Krakow. The situation was urgent but the "False Deutsche" Pole first needed to prepare false papers (from Krakow) for Tusio. By the time the papers were ready, Tusio could no longer be found.

Aunt Erna survived WWII by living in Lwow with Aryan papers. She knew of Lora's plan to hide Tusio with a priest in Boryslaw. After Lwow was liberated (July, 1944), she traveled to Boryslaw to look for Tusio. No one in the town knew what happened to the boy or to the priest – both could not be found. Tusio was about 5 yrs old at the time.
